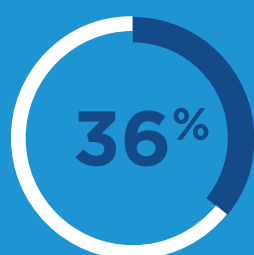
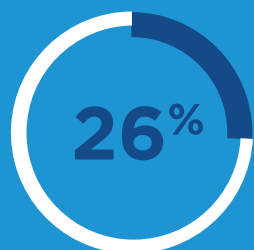




Are employees at your organisation at risk?
